

The Apostle Paul's Letters

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In *The Apostle Paul's Letters*, you will explore the thirteen Letters of Paul, the New Testaments oldest canonical texts. As a thoughtful Catholic, you will be astounded by these erudite lectures, available in either audio or video formats.

In the first part of this course, you will consider the way in which the Apostle Paul's letters were written and read in his lifetime. You will then look in depth at Paul's letters to the Thessalonians, Philippians, Philemon, Galatians, Corinthians, and Romans. By examining them in the chronological order in which they were written, you will appreciate how Paul's epistolary skills developed as he responded to the issues and concerns that prompted him to write to the five churches.

You will then explore the remaining texts in the Pauline corpus. The consensus today considers these epistles to be written by anonymous authors who paid homage to the apostle. You will look at Second Thessalonians, Colossians, and

Ephesians, analyzing the unique character of the texts and the circumstances that prompted their composition. Finally, you will examine the epistles addressed to Timothy and Titus. Second Timothy was written as a reflection on Paul's life and ministry, bringing this course to a fitting close.
